Most pupils begin their secondary education at the age of 11 (Year 7), but in some HMC schools pupils join the school at 13+ (Year 9). At the age of 16 (the end of Key stage 4 and Year 11), all pupils take a series of exams called the General Certificate of Secondary Education (GCSE), usually in about eight to ten subjects, which must include English and Mathematics.

216,500 work in primary schools, 208,300 work in secondary schools, 61,500 work in independent schools and 16,700 work in special schools. There are 425,200 teachers working in England, 22,000 teachers working in Wales, 43,500 teachers working in Scotland and 15,700 teachers working in Northern Ireland. 30.5% of these teachers are male, and 69.5% are female.
